

Rules for Best of the BBC News Magazine cover design competition

1. The BBC Code of Conduct for competitions can be found at www.bbc.co.uk/competitioncode
2. The competition is open to all users of the BBC News website except BBC employees and anyone connected with the competition.
3. Entry to the competition is via the form or link made available in the BBC News Magazine website (www.bbc.co.uk/magazine). Only entries submitted electronically will be considered. By submitting an entry, entrants give the BBC a non-exclusive right to publish the design on its website or in any media as it thinks fit. By submitting an entry, entrants are declaring that the design is their own work and that they have not infringed any copyrights.
4. All entrants must supply their names, addresses, e-mail addresses and a contact telephone number. The BBC will only ever use those addresses and numbers for the purposes of administering this competition, and will not publish them or provide them to anyone without permission. 5. All designs must fit the dimensions 190mm x 190mm. The winner will be the design considered to have been the most creative representation of a theme or themes of the year's news, or which illustrates the title 'Who, What, Why?' A shortlist of entries will be selected by the editorial team of the BBC News Magazine, and the final decision will be made by a judge whose name will be published, though the BBC retains the right to find a substitute judge should that become necessary.
6. No entries will be accepted after 1200 GMT on 22 December 2008. The winner will be announced on 24 December 2008.
7. There is no prize.
8. The BBC's decision as to the winner is final. No correspondence relating to the competition will be entered into.
9. There is no limit on the number of entries a person can make.
10. The BBC reserves the right to cancel or alter or amend the competition at any stage, if deemed necessary in its opinion, or if circumstances arise outside of its control.
