

20. Me siento mal - The Learning Section

Grammar

'ME GUSTA, ME DUELE...'

You may remember 'me gusta' which literally means 'it pleases me'

Me gusta I like it

Similarly, 'me duele la cabeza'. Literally, 'the head hurts me'

Me duele la cabeza My head hurts

When someone asks you if you like something they say:

¿Te gusta? ¿Le gusta? Do you like it?

Literally, 'does it please you?'

Similarly, they'd ask:

¿Te duele? ¿Le duele? Does it hurt?

There are other verbs that work in a similar 'back-to-front' way

¿Qué te/le parece? What do you think?

No me interesa I'm not interested

¿Qué te/le apetece? What do you fancy?

Me encantan las gambas I love prawns
