## More Grammar

### SAYING 'A' OR 'AN': UN, UNA

**Un** and **una** both mean a or an.

**un** momento a moment

**una** cerveza a beer

All Spanish nouns are feminine or masculine. **Una** goes with feminine nouns and **un** with masculine ones. It's easy to see how this works with people:

**un** hermano a brother

**una** hermana a sister

Generally, nouns ending in **-o** are masculine and those ending in **-a** are feminine. But there are exceptions:

**un** día a day

If a noun ends with neither letter, it's best to learn it with **un** or **una**: **un** café, a coffee, is masculine, but **una** calle, a street, is feminine.

**Un** and **una** can also mean one.
