<p>Learning hint</p> <p>'Little and often' is a good watchword when learning a new language. Spending just a short time on your Spanish every day will be more effective than a mammoth session once a week. It doesn't have to involve sitting down with a computer or a book; a conscious effort to focus on Spanish can be a great way of using 'dead' time in waiting rooms, queues or traffic jams. Try visualising images from Spanish Steps and recalling the related language. Or using car number plates to focus on the alphabet and numbers.</p>
