<p>Learning hint</p> <p>To get some practice at saying the time in Spanish, get your alarm clock, set different times at random and say what time it is. Then have a look in your diary and say aloud what time your appointments are for the next week or so.</p> <p>Once you're comfortable with the format, get used to thinking of the time in Spanish whenever you plan to do something – even routine activities such as going to work, eating your lunch or going to bed.</p>
