# Overview

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**Kotoku Baray (Open Secret)** is a radio drama and discussion programme that explores some of the more sensitive barriers that adolescent girls face and encourages conversations on these topics. Produced by BBC Media Action, the programme was first broadcast from May-November 2022 as part of the UK Aid-funded Every Adolescent Girl Empowered and Resilient (EAGER) project.

All the characters and locations that appear in Kotoku Baray are fictional. But the stories mirror the lives of girls in Sierra Leone. Through different characters and the situations they face, the programme considers the challenges of adolescence. It explores issues around relationships and sex, access to information and services, as well as violence against women and girls.

The common theme connecting the characters and storylines is the importance of listening to, believing in and supporting girls. Kotoku Baray emphasises the benefits of having supportive discussions between girls and boys, and their parents, caregivers and partners. The aim is to stimulate inter-generational conversations about topics which are not always discussed openly.

The programme is designed to be listened to sequentially as a complete series. Storylines run and issues are explored across multiple episodes. Characters develop, change and learn over time. Each episode consists of 15 minutes of drama followed by 15 minutes of pre-recorded discussion with community groups.
