1

A modest but spotless terraced house. Toast pops up.

ORLA

(doing breakfast for the
kids)

You're gonna miss your first
lesson.

Kyle (13), Callum (9) and Nancy (7) are at the table.

KYLE

I'm not. I'll miss Assembly and
everyone misses Assembly.

ORLA

(buttering toast)

If everyone misses assembly...

(to Callum)

You want jam on this?

CALLUM

Yeah.

ORLA

If everyone misses assembly, it's
not assembly.

(to Nancy)

Jam?

NANCY

Yeah.

ORLA

Please.

NANCY

You never told Callum to say it.

ORLA

(to Callum)

P.E. today, yeah?

CALLUM

Yeah.

ORLA

Your kit's in your bedroom. You
think you can manage that?

CALLUM

Yeah.

2 EXT. ORLA'S HOUSE. DAY 1

2

All four leave through the front door. Kyle goes one way, Orla (in a new, Primark suit), Callum and Nancy the other...

3 EXT. ROAD. DAY 1

3

A sweatbox (prison van) hurtling along. We go inside it.

4 INT. SWEATBOX. DAY 1

4

Stainless steel. The driver's radio blasting away. We hear Orla shouting. We go to her. She's in a tiny stainless steel cubicle. The seat's low so her cheap, new skirt rides up, exposing her thighs. She pushes at the hem. Pointless.

ORLA

He said he'd sort something out and he did nothing. He did nothing so I need my phone. Right? I need my phone 'cause my kids should've been picked up an hour ago. Will you please, please, please give me my phone?

In another cubicle we find KELSEY MORGAN. She's a heroin addict. She feels lousy and Orla's shouts aren't helping.

ORLA (O.S) (CONT'D)

They don't know where I am. Nobody knows where I am. Can't you see the situation I'm in here? My kids don't know where I am. Seven, nine and thirteen years old and they don't know where I am. So give me my phone. Please give me my phone.

Kelsey snaps.

KELSEY

You'll get a phone call later.
Right?

ORLA (O.S.)

When?

KELSEY

After reception.

ORLA (O.S)

When's reception?

KELSEY

I don't know.

ABI COCHRANE, also locked in a cubicle, also listening...

ORLA (O.S.)
How long does it take?

KELSEY (O.S.)
I don't know.

ORLA (O.S.)
Where are they taking us? We've
been hours in here so where are
they taking us?

KELSEY (O.S.)
I don't know!

ABI
Carlingford.

ORLA (O.S.)
Where's that?

ABI
Runcorn.

Back to Orla.

ORLA
For God's sake!!!!

And Orla starts pummeling at the door again.

Kelsey screams.

KELSEY
Will you stop it, you cracked mare?
Will you stop it?!

5 EXT. CARLINGFORD PRISON. NIGHT 1

5

CAPTION: NIGHT 1

The sweatbox enters Carlingford Prison.

6 INT. SWEATBOX. NIGHT 1

6

A dock officer opens Orla's cubicle.

ORLA
I need a pee and I need a phone.

7 INT. CARLINGFORD PRISON - RECEPTION. NIGHT 1

7

Kelsey and PRISON OFFICER MARTIN.

KELSEY

Can you make sure I'm down for 40 mils of methadone in the morning please 'cause last time I was in that didn't happen and I had to rattle for two days before I got anything and if that happens this time, I'll be dead? I'll be dead because my habit's bigger. It's miles bigger than last time. Right? So could you make a note of that please: much bigger heroin habit?

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

You'll need to speak to the nurse.

7A INT. CARLINGFORD PRISON - MEDICAL ROOM. NIGHT 1

7A

Kelsey and NURSE LORRAINE GARVEY.

NURSE GARVEY

We have a maximum of thirty mils of methadone.

KELSEY

You don't. You can give forty in exceptional circumstances.

NURSE GARVEY

You're not an exceptional circumstance.

KELSEY

I am. Because my habit has grown since the last time I was in.

NURSE GARVEY

I'll make a note of that for the doctor.

KELSEY

And he'll give me forty?

NURSE GARVEY

We'll see in the morning. Could you wee into that please?

KELSEY

I'm not pregnant.

NURSE GARVEY

Well, let's just make sure, hey?

8 INT. CARLINGFORD PRISON - RECEPTION. NIGHT 1

8

Abi and PRISON OFFICER CARTER.

PRISON OFFICER CARTER
You've transferred from Birchway
Prison?

ABI
Yeah.

PRISON OFFICER CARTER

Any good.

ABI

For three and half years it was
utter shit. Then it got a little
bit worse.

9

INT. CARLINGFORD PRISON - RECEPTION. NIGHT 1

9

Orla and Prison Officer Martin.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

This your first time in prison?

ORLA

Yes. Can I explain my situation?

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

Yes.

ORLA

I fiddled the lecky. Everyone said
you don't get sent to prison for
fiddling the lecky. So I...

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

You don't.

ORLA

Aggravating factors they said. So I
didn't tell anyone I was up in
court and I took my kids to school
as per normal. Now I don't know
who's picked them up but I suspect
it's Maggie so I need to phone her
and tell her I'll sort it in the
morning.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

And how will you sort it?

ORLA

I'll get the governor here to tell
that magistrate to let me go. I'm
in here, yeah, but my three kids
are doing the suffering.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

Good luck with that.

ORLA

So can I call Maggie please?

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

Soon.

ORLA

In that case I'll need my phone.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

You get your phone back when you're released.

ORLA

All my numbers are on it.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

Can you remember any?

ORLA

Yeah. One.

(dismay)

Oh God!

INT. CARLINGFORD PRISON - RECEPTION. NIGHT 1

10

Back to Kelsey and Nurse Garvey.

NURSE GARVEY

You're pregnant.

KELSEY

It's wrong. It's got to be wrong because there's no way I...

(she remembers)

Oh shit.

11

INT. INDUCTION WING - CORRIDOR / LANDING / KELSEY AND ABI'S CELL. NIGHT 1

Prison Officer Carter leading Kelsey and Abi.

KELSEY

Are those pregnancy tests ever wrong?

ABI

Did it say pregnant?

KELSEY

Yeah.

ABI

You're pregnant.

They reach locked gates. PO Carter will open them.

PRISON OFFICER CARTER

This is the wing. You'll be doing your induction here.

A couple of women shouting from their cells, another woman hammering on a door.

PRISON OFFICER CARTER (CONT'D)

Not pleasant but you'll only be here for a week or so. Unless you kick off of course, in which case you'll be here a while longer.

They reach a phone on the landing. PO Carter picks up the phone, puts her own ID in.

PRISON OFFICER CARTER (CONT'D)

(to Kelsey)
Number?

KELSEY
07700 900 365

PRISON OFFICER CARTER
365?

KELSEY
Yeah.

PRISON OFFICER CARTER
(eventually)
It's ringing.

Kelsey takes the phone.

KELSEY
It's me, Babe. I'm in Carlingford.
Yeah. You get a train and it's a twenty minute walk from the station. You cross over a bridge. It's all mapped out on the website. I'll send you a visiting order then will you get on it, Babe, and book one, yeah? You won't let me down, will you? Good. I'll stop this now and phone again when there's no one earwigging, okay? Right. Love you, Babe. Love you.

PO Carter takes the phone and puts her own number in again.

PRISON OFFICER CARTER
(to Abi)
Number?

Abi shakes her head.

PO Carter continues to lead the women across the landing. They reach a cell. PO Carter unlocks it.

PRISON OFFICER CARTER (CONT'D)
(to Abi and Kelsey)
In you go.

They go into the cell.

KELSEY
(of the bunks)
I'll have the bottom. I'm pregnant.

INT. INDUCTION WING - LANDING / ORLA'S CELL - NIGHT 1

12

Orla (now in prison issue jogging suit and with her reception kit - soap, toilet roll etc) and PO Martin walk the landing. They reach the phone.

The prison officer keys her ID into the phone.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN
Number?

ORLA
01632 960 442

She dials and hands the phone to Orla. Orla waits.

ORLA (CONT'D)
Hiya, Mam, it's me.
(beat)
Me. Orla.
(beat)
I'm fine. No, I'm not fine. I'm not
fine at all. I'm in prison.
(beat)
I'm in prison. I got six months
today for fiddling the lecky. I'm
phoning you from prison.
Carlingford.
(beat)
I haven't picked the kids up from
school but I think Maggie will have
done it so I want you to go round
there and say I'm sorry but can
she... She lives two doors down
from me, Mam, two down towards
Melrose Street. Yeah?
(beat)
Say I'm sorry but can she keep the
kids tonight and take them to
school in the morning and I'll
definitely sort something out
tomorrow. I'll get out of here or
something but I'll definitely sort
it... No! No, Mam. No. You're not
having them. You're not having
them, Mam, no.
(beat)
(MORE)

ORLA (CONT'D)

Because it won't work out because
it's never worked out because
you're not fit to have them, Mam.

(beat)

You're not. You're gonna leave them
with Maggie and I'll sort it
tomorrow. Right?

(beat)

Right. When you're there get her
phone number 'cause I haven't got
it. That's why I'm phoning you:
because I haven't got it...

She realises something, turns to the officer.

ORLA (CONT'D)

Can I make TWO phone calls
tomorrow?

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

No.

ORLA

I need two phone calls. One to get
a number off my mother and the
other to phone that number 'cause
it's the woman who's got my kids.
Right?

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

We'll see tomorrow.

ORLA

No! I need to know NOW. We're
talking about my kids here, love,
and I need to know now. Can I have
two phone calls tomorrow?

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

Yes.

ORLA

Thank you.

(back to the phone)

You'll get her number off her,
yeah?

(beat)

Okay, go now, Mam.

(beat)

No, go now, Mam. If you leave it
you'll fall asleep or something so
go now.

(beat)

Put your coat on, yeah. I'll wait.

She turns to PO Martin again.

ORLA (CONT'D)

She's an alcoholic and she's a bit...

She gestures: doolally.

ORLA (CONT'D)

(down phone again)

Are you there, Mam? Mam, are you there?

(to officer)

She's forgotten she's on the phone.

(down phone)

Mam! Mam!

(Mam comes back on. She's been putting her coat on)

Sorry, Mam. Go now then. Yeah, now. Thanks.

She puts the receiver down. She's drained.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

You called me "love."

ORLA

Did I?

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

Yeah. It's not "love." It's Miss or Miss Martin. Okay?

ORLA

Yes, Miss.

PO Martin leads Orla further down the landing to a cell.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

In here.

They enter the cell.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN (CONT'D)

You see that?

The emergency button.

ORLA

Yeah.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

You press that only in an emergency. If you're dying or something like that. Right?

ORLA

Right.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN

(leaving)

You'll get opened again at seven in
the morning. Good night.

ORLA

Night.

The cell door slams shut on Orla. From all around, the noises
of the prison.

13

INT. INDUCTION WING - LANDING / KELSEY AND ABI'S CELL - 13
NIGHT 1

PO Martin walking along the landing.

Kelsey listens to the officer's footsteps getting louder -
and now fading.

Kelsey reaches down her joggers and into her knickers. She
makes a small grunt as she pushes to open her vagina, pulls
out a little package.

Abi watches.

Kelsey opens the package. Unwrapping a twist of heroin, a
lighter and some foil.

ABI

What are you doing?

But Kelsey is too absorbed to answer. She prepares to smoke
the heroin.

ABI (CONT'D)

What are you doing, you stupid
bitch?

KELSEY

What d'you think?

ABI

You're pregnant.

KELSEY

Yeah.

ABI

You take that stuff, your baby
takes it too.

KELSEY

Fuck off, Mother Theresa.

14 INT. INDUCTION WING - ORLA'S CELL. NIGHT 1 14
Orla worried sick.

15 INT. INDUCTION WING - KELSEY AND ABI'S CELL. NIGHT 1 15
Abi awake on her bunk, Kelsey asleep. The tap dripping.

TANYA HELSBY (O.S.)
You three new ones?

CUT BETWEEN ORLA's cell AND ABI AND KELSEY's cell.

ABI
Yeah.

TANYA HELSBY (O.S.)
What you in for?

Abi can't answer that.

TANYA HELSBY (O.S.) (CONT'D)
How long are you doing?

16 INT. INDUCTION WING - ORLA'S CELL. NIGHT 1 16

ORLA
Six months.

TANYA HELSBY (O.S.)
What for?

ORLA
I fiddled the lecky.

Laughter.

TANYA HELSBY (O.S.)
And you two?

17 INT. INDUCTION WING - KELSEY AND ABI'S CELL. NIGHT 1 17
Kelsey's out of it.

ABI
She's in for drugs.

TANYA HELSBY (O.S.)
And you?

ABI
(after a pause)
Life.

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TANYA HELSBY (O.S.)

What for?

ABI

I killed my sister in law.

Orla's reaction to this...

A little respectful silence from the others.

TANYA HELSBY (O.S.)

Why?

ABI

She annoyed me.

LATER...

Abi still awake on her bunk. The tap is still dripping but we're beginning to hear wind and crashing waves. Louder and louder: wind and waves...

INT. INDUCTION WING. LANDING / ORLA'S CELL - DAY 2

18

It's dawn and someone is scrubbing - whoosh, whoosh, whoosh.

Orla rubs a blood stained sheet with an old bit of sponge and her soap. Pointless. Gives up.

Goes to the toilet. Pulls a bloody wadge of loo roll from her pants. Flushes it. Makes another wadge from the now-only-half-left loo roll, pushes it into her pants.

Now she pulls the lavatory chain. Water gushing. Washes the seat with her sponge.

Now she's washing the sink.

Now she spreads her blanket on top of her (sheetless) bunk. Lies on top of that.

Wide awake.

19

INT. INDUCTION WING - LANDING / EXT./INT. CARLINGFORD PRISON -
MEDS DISPENSARY. DAY 2

Morning. Kelsey in a crowd of women heading for their meds.

Deafening noise. Women bark out their names and prison numbers to Nurse Garvey, swallow their meds, show their open mouths and wheel away.

Then it's Kelsey's turn.

NURSE GARVEY

There's nothing down for you.

KELSEY

There should be methadone for me.

NURSE GARVEY

You don't need it. You were observed last night sleeping like a baby.

KELSEY

You observed me?

NURSE GARVEY

Yeah.

KELSEY

No one told me that.

NURSE GARVEY

How remiss of us. Move away please.

KELSEY

(suddenly desperate)

There's a reason I was sleeping.

NURSE GARVEY

Yeah?

KELSEY

Yeah. I brought some stuff in with me and...

NURSE GARVEY

Whoa! You tell me you've taken drugs and it's CSU. And you'll do nothing in CSU but rattle. Anything else?

KELSEY

No, Miss.

NURSE GARVEY

Move on then please.

Kelsey wheels away. She's devastated.

20

INT. INDUCTION WING - CORRIDOR / EXT. ASSOCIATION YARD. DAY 02

Orla also getting bad news from an older male prison officer, PRISON OFFICER ROSS. Abi is nearby.

ORLA

She said I'd get two phone calls first thing this morning.

PRISON OFFICER ROSS

Who told you this?

ORLA

The prison officer last night.

PRISON OFFICER ROSS
She had no right to tell you that.
It could take a few days.

Kelsey is approaching.

ORLA

PRISON OFFICER ROSS
You do what you're told to do and
right now that's induction. Are you
Kelsey Morgan?

KELSEY
Yes, Sir.

PRISON OFFICER ROSS
Come with us.

PO ROSS walks away. The others follow.

ORLA
It's absolutely essential for me to
make a phone call, love, 'cause
I've got...

PRISON OFFICER ROSS
It's 'Sir' not 'love'

ORLA (CONT'D)
Three kids. Seven, nine and
thirteen.

ORLA (CONT'D)
(chasing after)
Sir. I've got three kids, Sir, and
they're seven, nine and thirteen,
and I want to know how they are.

PRISON OFFICER ROSS
(still walking)
Induction usually lasts a week to
ten days...

21

INT. INDUCTION WING - ORLA'S CELL. DAY 2

21

Orla alone, listening to the noise of the prison. Suddenly her door (which was ajar) begins opening wider. Once open we see it's MARIE-LOUISE O'DELL.

MARIE-LOUISE
Orla O'Riordan?

ORLA
Yes.

MARIE-LOUISE
I'm guessing you're catholic.

ORLA

Yes.

MARIE-LOUISE

I'm Marie-Louise. I'm a nun with
the chaplaincy team.

ORLA

Right.

MARIE-LOUISE

You need to make a phone call?

ORLA

Yes.

MARIE-LOUISE

Come with me then.

Orla is moved to tears. Huge relief.

ORLA

Oh thank you. Thank you.

22

INT. INDUCTION WING - LANDING / EXT. PASSAGEWAYS. DAY 2 22

The walk to the chaplains' office. Marie-Louise unlocks and
locks a gate.

MARIE-LOUISE

First time in prison?

ORLA

Yeah.

MARIE-LOUISE

It's getting to you?

ORLA

Yeah.

MARIE-LOUISE

You'll be okay. Some of the nicest
people you'll ever meet are in
prison.

She unlocks and locks another gate.

ORLA

What do I tell the kids?

MARIE-LOUISE

D'you want them to come and see
you?

ORLA

Yeah.

MARIE-LOUISE

The truth then.

23 INT. CHAPEL / CHAPLAINCY OFFICE. DAY 2

23

Orla and Marie-Louise walk through the chapel and enter the chaplaincy office. Marie-Louise picks up the phone.

MARIE-LOUISE

What's the number?

ORLA

01632

MARIE-LOUISE

Yeah.

ORLA

960

MARIE-LOUISE

Yeah

ORLA

442

MARIE-LOUISE

(passing her the phone)

It's ringing.

ORLA

Hiya, Mam. It's me.

We cut between Orla and her Mum - ELIZABETH O'RIORDAN.

24 INT. ELIZABETH'S HOME - DAY 2

24

ELIZABETH

How are you?

ORLA

I'm fine. You?

ELIZABETH

I'm fine.

ORLA

Did you sort it?

ELIZABETH

No.

ORLA

No?

ELIZABETH

I've brought the kids here.

ORLA

What?!

ELIZABETH

What's the alternative? Maggie
can't keep them.

ORLA

I told you not to do that, Mam,
because...

ELIZABETH

What's the alternative?

ORLA

...you can't cope. You won't be
able to...

ELIZABETH

I'll tell you what the alternative
is...

ORLA

...cope with them 'cause you drink,
Mam, and you'll get pissed and
you'll harm them.

ELIZABETH

I'll tell you what the alternative
is. The alternative is they go into
care. And if they go into care,
they get separated, they get split
up. Is that what you want?

ORLA

No. That's exactly what I was
trying to avoid 'cause if you have
them, they WILL go into care. They
will definitely go into care.

ELIZABETH

I didn't drink last night.

ORLA

We've been here before, Mam.

ELIZABETH

I'll not have a drink till you're
out. I promise you that.

ORLA

You've promised it before. They'll
end up minding you just like I did.

ELIZABETH

They will not. I promise.

An impasse.

ELIZABETH (CONT'D)

Shall I bring them in to see you?

ORLA

(to Marie-Louise)

How far's Huddersfield from here?

MARIE-LOUISE

Sixty miles, something like that.

ORLA

It's sixty miles, Mam. You're not up to that.

ELIZABETH

We'll do it.

Orla is losing it.

ELIZABETH (CONT'D)

For God's sake: all you did was try to keep your kids warm.

That finishes Orla.

ORLA

I've got to go, Mam.

She kills the call. She tries to recover.

ORLA (CONT'D)

(to Marie-Louise)

She's an alcoholic.

Marie-Louise nods.

25

EXT. ASSOCIATION YARD / INT. INDUCTION WING / CORRIDOR. DAY

Orla and Marie-Louise making their way back. They reach the gate to the induction wing, but it's association and it's chocker, the noise deafening.

Marie-Louise unlocks the gate and Orla goes through.

ORLA

Thanks.

MARIE-LOUISE

No worries.

Orla goes on alone - through women laughing, women arguing, women taking the piss out of each other, two women hands entwined.

Abi, talking to someone, glances over at Orla, watches her enter her cell.

26 INT. INDUCTION WING - ORLA'S CELL. DAY 2

26

Orla sits on her bunk. Abi appears at the door. On Orla, nervous.

ABI
Orla, yeah?

ORLA
Yeah.

ABI
You okay?

ORLA
Yeah.

ABI
You want to talk?

ORLA
No.

Abi stays. Waits. Orla feels she has to say something.

ORLA (CONT'D)
Can I get another toilet roll?

ABI
No.

Abi clocks the sheet in a heap by the sink, disappears.

Comes back seconds later with some sanitary pads and a few sheets of bog roll.

ABI (CONT'D)
You can get plenty of these
(pads)
But you have to buy more of this
(bog roll)

ORLA
I'm not even due on. It's 'cos my
pills are at home.

ABI
Well you'll not need them in here.

A dry smile that Orla doesn't return.

ABI (CONT'D)
You alright on your own?

ORLA
Yeah.

ABI
You could share.

ORLA
I'm fine.

ABI
What are they - your kids? I heard
you talking...

ORLA
Two boys and a girl.

ABI
Lovely.
(Orla nods)
Take a job.

ORLA
What?

ABI
You'll miss them just as much with
a job but it'll hurt a little bit
less. It'll be laundry or kitchen.

ORLA
I hate cooking.

ABI
Then tell them bright lights give
you migraines. That way you'll get
laundry.

ORLA
Thanks.

Abi waits but nothing comes back. Abi goes. On Orla: the end
of her very first conversation with a murderer.

27 INT. INDUCTION WING - LANDING. NIGHT 2

27

Slam! PO Martin locking the last few cell doors. PO Martin
locks the final door and walks off.

28 INT. INDUCTION WING - KELSEY AND ABI'S CELL. NIGHT 2

28

Kelsey listens to PO Martin's footsteps fading. She takes a
wrap of heroin from beneath her mattress and starts
preparing.

ABI

Where d'you get that?

KELSEY

Friend.

ABI

Did they do a blood test as well as
a urine?

KELSEY

Yeah.

ABI

What did it say?

KELSEY

Don't know. They sent it off to a
lab or something.

ABI

But if it comes back pregnant?

KELSEY

Abortion.

ABI

Abortion?

That makes Kelsey study Abi.

KELSEY

Yeah. Why?

ABI

You're on remand, aren't you?

KELSEY

Yeah.

ABI

Judges don't like handing out long
stretches to pregnant women.

KELSEY

He's GOT to though. A kilo of class
A's.

ABI

Yeah. But he'll go easier if you're
pregnant.

Kelsey's reaction.

It's suddenly morning and Abi is shaking Kelsey.

ABI

Where is it? Where is it, you
thieving bitch. Where's...

KELSEY

(waking up)
What?

ABI

my hair oil and my cream? You
swapped it, didn't...

KELSEY

I don't know what you're talking
about.

ABI

you, you thieving bitch? You
swapped it for that smack you...

KELSEY

No.

ABI

had last night so WHO WITH? Right?
I want to know who you...

KELSEY

I didn't swap anything.

ABI

swapped it with. I want to know
right now who you swapped it with
or I go out there and tell everyone
you're a thieving bitch who robs
off her padmate. Who did you swap
it with?

KELSEY

No one.

ABI

Fuck you then.

And Abi is leaving the cell onto the somewhat busy landing.

30

INT. INDUCTION WING - LANDING / KELSEY AND ABI'S CELL / 30
TANYA'S CELL. DAY 3

ABI

(to all)

I'm padded up with a thief. A thief
who's robbed my oil and my cream
and swapped it for a bit of brown.
So who's she done that with? Who's
she swapped my oil and my cream
with?

(MORE)

ABI (CONT'D)

I don't know these things 'cause
I've only been here five minutes
so, please, tell me, who has she
swapped my oil and my cream with?

Nothing - so she goes back to Kelsey, in the cell.

ABI (CONT'D)

Who did you swap with?
(Kelsey says nothing)
Who did you swap with?

And, bang, Abi slaps her really hard.

ABI (CONT'D)

Who did you swap with?
(slapping her again)

KELSEY

Tanya.

ABI

Thank you!
(leaving the cell, heading
for Tanya stood at her
own cell door)

It's morning and Windsor is busy and noisy. Tanya, her face bruised, walks through the throng. She goes into the kitchen.

Abi (her face less bruised) Kelsey, Orla and other inmates are in here sorting out their breakfasts.

Tanya lifts the kettle - full enough, flicks it on.

As it boils, Kelsey eyes it nervously. Abi reaches for a tin of tuna, grasps it tightly, ready for trouble.

Tanya drops a tea bag into a mug. Lifts the kettle. Pours some hot water.

We can see the steam. We can see the whites of Abi's knuckles around the tin. Also the scrapes from the battering she gave Tanya.

TANYA
(under)
Bitch.

Tanya leaves with her cup of tea, heads into the TV lounge. Some women follow her.

Kelsey, hands on her belly, breathes again.

PO Carter enters.

PRISON OFFICER CARTER.
Association time, ladies.

Kelsey heads towards the door and is let outside. We go with her.

Kelsey walking. She reaches PO Martin.

KELSEY
Tanya's got a blade.

PRISON OFFICER MARTIN
Tanya Helsby?

KELSEY
Yeah.

Kelsey walks on.

Tanya, Donna and another prisoner. Officers Martin, Carter and another officer wearing body cams suddenly burst into their room.
