EXT. PARK

F/X: LAWRENCE, THE PARK KEEPER (40s), JANGLES HIS KEYS AS HE PREPARES TO UNLOCK A SHED.

KATRINA: Don't open that shed!

LAWRENCE: Hello Katrina. How's your mum and dad?

KATRINA: Oh, you know, they're normal. Completely normal. Why wouldn't they be?

LAWRENCE: Must be a bit funny, living with them again, staying in your old bedroom, now you're 34!

KATRINA: Yes, it's hilarious. In fact it's one of the most amusing things about being trapped in a village that's been invaded by aliens and cut off from the outside world.

LAWRENCE: Isn't it strange how life turns out.

KATRINA: It's stranger than I expected, Lawrence, I'll give you that.

LAWRENCE: I need to get on and mow this grass.

KATRINA: No you don't! Put your feet up. I'll do it.

LAWRENCE: But you don't know how to drive the ride-on mower.

KATRINA: Yes I do.

KATRINA: Yes. When I lived in London I drove a ride-on mower every day.

LAWRENCE: I thought you worked for an educational charity.

KATRINA: I did. I do.

LAWRENCE: So why were you driving a ride-on mower every day?

KATRINA: (BEAT) Because... they're... exempt from the Congestion Charge.

LAWRENCE: I'll have to remember that next time I'm down.

KATRINA: Yes, you will. Although by then the entire planet will probably have been invaded by aliens, seeing as how Lucy and I are the only ones trying to stop them.

LAWRENCE: Oh, I expect it'll all blow over.

KATRINA: Yes, probably, I'm sure it's nothing to worry about. So if you want to pop along, I'll mow this grass for you.

LAWRENCE: No, you're all right. Until this alien invasion business, I hadn't realised just how much of my sense of identity was bound up with keeping a large expanse of grass from growing past a certain point.

F/X: LAWRENCE STARTS UNLOCKING THE SHED.

KATRINA: Lawrence! No –

F/X: AND HE OPENS THE SHED DOOR.

LAWRENCE: Good lord!

MINION: (ALIEN PATHETIC HELP)

LUCY: This isn't what it looks like.

LAWRENCE: It looks like you're holding one of the lower-ranking aliens hostage, Lucy.

LUCY: Oh! That's alright then. I was afraid it looked like we were doing some kind of bondage game.

LAWRENCE: I'm reporting this to their leader.

KATRINA: No, don't do that.

F/X: LAWRENCE STRIDES AWAY.

LAWRENCE: (OFF) Sorry Katrina. See you at the pub quiz tonight?

KATRINA: Yes, I'll be there. (TO LUCY) So what now?

LUCY: We could take the ride-on lawnmower and trash my parents' garden with it.

KATRINA: Why?

LUCY: For fun.

KATRINA: No.

LUCY: We could have a ride round the park on the ride-on lawnmower?

KATRINA: (BEAT) All right, but I'm driving.

MINION: (ALIEN ME TOO?)

KATRINA: No, not you too.

INT. ULJABAAN'S HOUSE

F/X: USUAL AMBIANCE.

MARGARET: Mr Uljabaan, I wondered if I might raise some of the residents' issues with you.

ULJABAAN: Fine, Margaret, but I can't promise I'll listen. When I hear anything about the problems of lesser life forms I tend to tune out.

MARGARET: (BEAT) Right.

ULJABAAN: No offence.

MARGARET: If you say so. Now. Linda Morgan is pregnant.

ULJABAAN: Really?

MARGARET: I know, it's such good news. They've been trying for years.

ULJABAAN: Computer?

COMPUTER: Yes?

ULJABAAN: Make a note – it seems those chemicals we put in the humans' water supply have had the opposite effect.

MARGARET: What chemicals?

ULJABAAN: So, she's pregnant, what am I supposed to do?

COMPUTER: Would you like me to knit her some booties?

MARGARET: If you like, but more pressingly, she needs someone to do her three-month scan. Can you do that?

COMPUTER: Yes. I can also project a hologram of a man in a white coat with a soothing manner and nice, sympathetic eyes.

F/X: BLEEP: HOLOGRAM APPEARS.

HOLOGRAM DOCTOR: What seems to be the problem?

MARGARET: Ooh, that's very good.

ULJABAAN: Thank you Computer, that's enough.

F/X: HOLOGRAM IS SWITCHED OFF.

ULJABAAN: Next issue, please.

MARGARET: Andrew Milway would like you to fit a new back door for him.

ULJABAAN: I'm the commander of a planetary invasion force, not a double-glazing salesman.

MARGARET: I know, but it's not shutting properly and as we're cut off from the outside world, he can't get it repaired himself.

ULJABAAN: Tell him he'll have to make do. What else?

MARGARET: A very minor thing – you know the pear tree Leonard and Beth Alexander have in their front garden?

ULJABAAN: No.

MARGARET: I'd like you to cut it down please.

ULJABAAN: Why?

MARGARET: Do you know why we didn't win Best Kept Village In Buckinghamshire in 2009?

ULJABAAN: Because there was at least one village in Buckinghamshire that was better kept than this one?

MARGARET: Because of that tree. There's a long branch that overhangs the pavement, and they never pick the pears so every autumn they fall on the path and everyone treads them in. I told them to clean it up, but whilst everyone else was pulling together,

painting the benches, repointing the brickwork, creating a floral tribute to Tim Henman on the village green, they just sat on their bottoms and left a slick of rotten pear mulch.

ULJABAAN: Right. But as you're not going to be entering Best Kept Village In Buckinghamshire again any time soon, [it seems –]

F/X: LAWRENCE RUSHES IN.

LAWRENCE: Mr Uljabaan, sir!

ULJABAAN: What is it, Lawrence the Park Keeper?

LAWRENCE: I've just found one of your troops locked in my shed.

ULJABAAN: Ohhh – I thought I was one short.

MARGARET: Katrina did this, didn't she?

LAWRENCE: Er, yes.

MARGARET: I'm so sorry.

ULJABAAN: It isn't your fault. (BEAT) Well, it is in the sense that if you hadn't chosen to breed, she wouldn't exist. But apart from that.

MARGARET: So, about this pear tree –

ULJABAAN: Yes – I'd rather not get involved, on the grounds that I find the entire business tedious and baffling.

MARGARET: (BEAT) Right. As long as you've given it fair consideration.

ULJABAAN: I haven't, really. That's one of the perks of being in charge.

MARGARET: Goodbye then.

F/X: MARGARET LEAVES.

ULJABAAN: Thank you for bringing me this information, Park Keeper.

LAWRENCE: It's no trouble, sir.

ULJABAAN: Your loyalty is appreciated. Computer! Stamp his loyalty card.

COMPUTER: Hold it out.

F/X: MECHANICAL STAMPING NOISE.

ULJABAAN: I see you have eight stamps. You may have a reward. What would you like?

LAWRENCE: I can ask for anything?

ULJABAAN: Yes.

LAWRENCE: And I can have it?

ULJABAAN: As long as you don't take the piss, yes.

INT. LYONS HOUSE

F/X:

KATRINA ENTERS.

KATRINA: Hi Dad.

RICHARD: Hello love. What have you been up to?

KATRINA: Kidnapped one of Uljabaan's minions. Questioned him. Couldn't understand a word he was saying. Got found out. Let him go.

RICHARD: Cheer up, pub quiz tonight. See if we can make it five wins on the bounce.

KATRINA: I suspect the powers that be won't let that happen.

RICHARD: No. (BEAT) Sorry, what are you talking about?

KATRINA: Oh come on, you just know that Uljabaan hates that I keep winning the pub quiz.

RICHARD: (BEAT) Does he?

KATRINA: Of course. Probably. He's never said he does, or ever mentioned the pub quiz at all, but I'm the figurehead of the resistance. Any victory of mine reflects badly on him.

RICHARD: I think he's got more important things to do than stop us winning a pub quiz.

KATRINA: I don't know about that. The other day I saw him personally removing a caricature of him Lucy had scratched into the

perspex window of the bus shelter, and then he drew one of her.

F/X: MARGARET ENTERS.

MARGARET: Oh, Katrina.

KATRINA: What are you Oh, Katrinaing me for now?

MARGARET: You tried to kidnap one of Mr Uljabaan's troops, didn't you.

KATRINA: I didn't try to, Mum, I did. Why do you always have to belittle my success?

MARGARET: It was spectacularly ill-timed.

RICHARD: Why?

MARGARET: I was just about to convince Uljabaan to cut down the Alexanders' pear tree.

KATRINA: Not the pear tree again. I thought you gave up on this years ago?

RICHARD: As far as your mother's concerned, revenge is a dish best served long after everyone thinks it's dead. Then it leaps up off the plate and bites your face off.

MARGARET: This is not about revenge.

RICHARD: She also believes revenge is a dish best served under another name entirely, so you think you're being served a nice pie, whereas in fact you're being served very, very cold revenge.

MARGARET: I'm serious. It's a hazard. Someone will break a leg.

KATRINA: Gosh, Mum. It almost sounds like you're showing a concern for health and safety.

MARGARET: No. It's common sense.

KATRINA: Common sense about health and safety.

MARGARET: Health and safety is only a problem when it goes too far.

KATRINA: So what level of illness and danger do you feel is appropriate? Scurvy and electrocution?

MARGARET: Katrina –

KATRINA: Or whooping cough and avalanches?

RICHARD: Dropsy and flying in a snowstorm.

MARGARET: Don't you start.

KATRINA: Shingles and putting a rug on a polished floor.

MARGARET: You may mock, but I'm going to get that tree taken down by hook or by crook.

KATRINA: If those are the choices, I'd go for the hook, but I think an axe might be more useful.

INT. PUB

F/X: LIVELY ATMOSPHERE. RON HAS A MICROPHONE PLUGGED INTO THE SPEAKER SYSTEM.

RON: (D) Are we ready to start the quiz?

LAWRENCE: No, Ron – we're still waiting for one of our team to get here.

RON: (D) All right, five minutes. You can get on with the picture round.

RICHARD: Easy picture round this week.

KATRINA: But what's the connection?

RICHARD: They all played Bond girls.

KATRINA: What about Kim Basinger?

RICHARD: She was in Never Say Never Again.

KATRINA: Never Say Never Again doesn't count.

RICHARD: Ron thinks it does.

KATRINA: Nobody thinks Never Say Never Again counts. Are you sure this isn't a trick question?

RICHARD: What else would the connection be?

KATRINA: (BEAT) That they're all actresses Ron fancies?

RICHARD: No, that can't be it because I remember him saying he'd really gone off Teri Hatcher.

KATRINA: Poor Teri. She'll be so cut up when she finds out.

F/X: DOOR OPENS, MINION ENTERS.

MINION: (ALIEN GREETING)

LAWRENCE: Great, here he is – Ron, we can start.

KATRINA: One of Uljabaan's troops is joining your team?

LAWRENCE: No, the thing he's carrying is joining our team.

COMPUTER: Hello.

MINION: (ALIEN QUESTION?)

LAWRENCE: Yeah, just put him on the table.

F/X: MINION PUTS IT DOWN ON THE TABLE.

RICHARD: Uljabaan's Computer?

LAWRENCE: Yep.

KATRINA: But that's not fair. The Computer's got a database containing every book ever written and everything that's ever been posted on the internet.

COMPUTER: Yep.

RICHARD: Ron – this is against the rules, isn't it? No technology allowed.

RON: (D) We've never written the rules down. I like to keep it flexible.

RICHARD: But it's an unwritten rule, surely?

RON: (D) No, we only have one unwritten rule and that is that we don't write down the rules.

COMPUTER: Uljabaan said if I wasn't allowed to take part, then he would make pub quizzes illegal, to be punishable by death.

RICHARD: (BEAT) Then maybe it isn't in the rules.

KATRINA: Did you get this for telling Uljabaan we'd kidnapped one of his troops?

LAWRENCE: Yes.

KATRINA: Those bloody loyalty cards.

MINION: (ALIEN QUESTION?)

LAWRENCE: You're alright mate, you can pick him up after the quiz.

MINION: (ALIEN RIGHTO)

F/X: MINION LEAVES.

RON: (D) Eyes down please. Round One. General Knowledge.
Question One. What is the chemical symbol for magnesium?

COMPUTER: Big M, little g.

F/X: ALL THE TEAMS WRITE THIS DOWN.

LAWRENCE: Yeah great, but could you whisper?

COMPUTER: (WHISPERS) Sorry.

EXT. PUB

F/X: MINION WALKS OUTSIDE. THERE IS A COMMOTION
NEARBY INVOLVING LUCY AND MARGARET.

LUCY: So you admit it?

MARGARET: Of course. That tree has to go!

LUCY: You can't get Uljabaan to cut that tree down, you just can't!

MINION: (ALIEN STEADY ON LADIES)

LUCY: Get your paws off me!

MINION: (ALIEN SORRY)

LUCY: She wants them to cut the tree down! You dreadful witch! Well, I won't let you, you hear me? I won't!

F/X: LUCY RUNS OFF, HYSTERICALLY.

MINION: (ALIEN IS SHE OK?)

MARGARET: Yes, she's suffering from a medical condition we call 'being seventeen'. She'll get over it.

INT. PUB

F/X: QUIZ WRAPPING UP.

RON: (D) Runners-up with sixty-nine points are Parallel Lyons...

RICHARD: Bloody hell. We won last week with sixty-four.

RON: (D) And the winners with eighty-one points are Lawrence and the Machine!

F/X: LAWRENCE AND HIS TEAM CHEER. OTHERS MAKE DISGRUNTLED NOISES.

KATRINA: But there were only eighty questions.

RON: (D) They got a bonus point for having the best team name.

RICHARD: I told you we should have gone with Two Lyons On The Shirt.

KATRINA: It doesn't make any sense, Dad, we're not on a shirt.

RICHARD: What a farce. One of the silver linings of being cut off from the outside world by an alien invasion was that people couldn't use their phones to cheat on the pub quiz.

KATRINA: I told you Uljabaan would put a stop to our winning streak somehow, but it's not enough to get at me – he has to hurt my family too.

RICHARD: I'm not hurt, love, it's just annoying.

INT. ULJABAAN'S HOUSE

F/X: NEXT MORNING. LAWRENCE ENTERS.

ULJABAAN: Ah, good morning, Park Keeper.

LAWRENCE: I just wanted to say thanks for letting us use your Computer in the pub quiz last night, Mr Uljabaan.

ULJABAAN: Not at all.

LAWRENCE: And if there's anything else I can do, that might be appreciated in a similar way, prior to the next pub quiz, I'd be only too happy to help.

ULJABAAN: I shall bear it in mind.

LAWRENCE: So like, if you need any help cutting down the pear tree in the Alexanders' front garden...

ULJABAAN: I don't.

LAWRENCE: I've got a lot of experience removing large plants, and I've never lost a finger to a chainsaw yet. (BEAT) Two toes, but you don't miss toes. Look, I can balance on one foot and you'd never know the difference.

ULJABAAN: I have no intention of cutting down the pear tree.

LAWRENCE: Really?

ULJABAAN: Really.

LAWRENCE: I'll tell Lucy she doesn't need to chain herself to it then.

ULJABAAN: Yes, why don't you – (BEAT) Lucy Alexander?

LAWRENCE: Yeah. I say chain, she's used an old bike lock.

ULJABAAN: She's chained herself to the tree? Why?

LAWRENCE: To save it from you.

ULJABAAN: Can we be clear on this? Lucy Alexander wants to save a tree?

MINION: (ALIEN INTERJECTION)

ULJABAAN: Curious. Gantac says he saw Miss Alexander arguing with Margaret about the tree outside the Rose & Crown last night. Computer?

COMPUTER: Yes.

ULJABAAN: Run a personality profile of Lucy Alexander and calculate the probability that she would ever genuinely care about a tree.

F/X: **BLEEP.**

COMPUTER: Probability calculated at three point six four per cent.

ULJABAAN: Exactly as I thought.

COMPUTER: What, right down to the same number?

ULJABAAN: Broadly similar to what I thought. Thank you again for this information, Park Keeper.

LAWRENCE: Can I have the Computer for the next pub quiz?

ULJABAAN: Yes, Park Keeper, yes.

LAWRENCE: Brilliant. (BEAT) You do know that Park Keeper isn't my name, don't you?

ULJABAAN: No it is, I changed it for you in the official records. Makes life simpler for everyone. (BEAT) It would be nice if you said thank you.

LAWRENCE: Thank you.

INT. LYONS HOUSE (KITCHEN)

F/X: **KATRINA ENTERS.**

KATRINA: Morning Mum. Why are you looking out of the window?

MARGARET: There's a man in the coal bunker.

KATRINA: A man?

MARGARET: Yes.

KATRINA: Did you put him there?

MARGARET: No, I think he's spying on you.

KATRINA: What makes you think that?

MARGARET: There's a cable leading out of the coal bunker that goes into a microphone that he's wedged into the cat flap.

F/X: **RICHARD ENTERS.**

RICHARD: Is he still there?

MARGARET: Yes. What about the one hiding out front, in the wheelie bin?

RICHARD: I got rid of him.

MARGARET: How?

RICHARD: I took advantage of the 'wheeled' aspect of the wheelie bin. You know who it was?

MARGARET: Who?

RICHARD: Mike.

MARGARET: Why is Mike spying on us?

RICHARD: Isn't it obvious? He wants to win the pub quiz.

KATRINA: Oh bloody hell.

RICHARD: If they find out something about what Katrina's up to and dob her in to Uljabaan, they're hoping they'll get the Computer on their team. I bet that's Gary Morley in the coal bunker.

MARGARET: How are we going to get rid of him?

RICHARD: Set fire to the coal?

KATRINA: I expect he'll go away if he finds out something useful he can tell Uljabaan, such as the fact that (LOUDLY) I put poison in Uljabaan's morning coffee and at any moment he might drink it and die.

F/X: PAUSE. NOTHING HAPPENS.

KATRINA: (LOUDLY) Although if someone got there in time to warn him, his life would be saved and he'd be eternally grateful.

F/X: OUTSIDE, SOMEONE GETS OUT OF A COAL BUNKER AND RUNS FROM THE GARDEN.

MARGARET: He's gone. What a lot of fuss just to win a silly pub quiz.

RICHARD: Ah, now Margaret, I've been to silly pub quizzes and the Rose & Crown's pub quiz is not silly.

KATRINA: Also, it was nice that we had something to do together. We're a good team. Dad knows the ones about sport and old films and TV shows, and I know the ones about important stuff.

RICHARD: Isn't there anything we can do?

KATRINA: Lucy and I are having a resistance meeting later, maybe we can work something out then.

MARGARET: I'm not sure you will be having a resistance meeting with Lucy.

KATRINA: Why not?

MARGARET: She's chained to a tree.

RICHARD: Who chained her to a tree?

MARGARET: She chained herself to the tree.

KATRINA: That's bloody inconsiderate of her.

MARGARET: I'm on my way out to see her now, I'll tell her you said that.

KATRINA: Yes, do.

F/X: MARGARET LEAVES.

KATRINA: I think we need to get Ron onside. Let's go and see him as soon as I've had a shower.

RICHARD: Right. I did a sweep of the bathroom earlier and I'm ninety per cent sure I've removed all the hidden cameras.

KATRINA: Or maybe I'll skip the shower today.

EXT. LUCY'S HOUSE

F/X: ULJABAAN APPROACHES.

ULJABAAN: Sorry I'm late. Some idiot ran into my HQ screaming about how my coffee had been poisoned. I don't even drink coffee.

MARGARET: That's all right, Mr Uljabaan.

ULJABAAN: Ah! Good morning, Miss Alexander.

LUCY: Morning.

ULJABAAN: Why do you want to save this tree?

LUCY: Because trees are like, life, and the lungs of the planet, and we shouldn't cut them down.

ULJABAAN: I cut down four trees behind the church last week and you didn't chain yourself to any of those.

LUCY: (BEAT) All right, yeah – this tree... is like the sister I never had.

MARGARET: Oh, really –

LUCY: No, it's true. I climbed it, I played in it, when the pears fell I made pear crumble out of them... and I've never told anyone this, but when Mum and Dad didn't have time for me, I'd come out here and talk to it, and it sounds silly but... it was always there for me.

ULJABAAN: (BEAT; TOUCHED) I see. Well, if that's –

MARGARET: Oh don't be so gullible.

ULJABAAN: (COLLECTING HIMSELF) What?

MARGARET: You don't believe any of this rubbish do you?

ULJABAAN: Who said I believed it?

LUCY: But it's true.

ULJABAAN: She says it's true.

MARGARET: She's never climbed this tree in her life. It doesn't have enough low branches to get up. And as for the crumble part –

LUCY: I did make crumble.

MARGARET: What are the three main ingredients of a crumble topping?

LUCY: (BEAT) Sugar... milk and... rice?

MARGARET: She's got another reason for protecting this tree and she doesn't want you to know what it is.

ULJABAAN: Miss Alexander, I'm taking you for interrogation.

LUCY: How are you going to do that when I'm chained to this tree?

ULJABAAN: I can either threaten you until you tell me what the combination for the bike lock is, or cut through the chain of the bike lock, or simply uproot the tree with you still attached to it, and take the whole thing in for interrogation.

LUCY: All right, I'll tell you the combination.

ULJABAAN: Very wise. Gantac!

MINION: (ALIEN YES LEADER?)

ULJABAAN: Write this down.

MINION: (ALIEN OK)

LUCY: The combination is: one...

MINION: (ALIEN ONE...)

LUCY: Two...

MINION: (ALIEN TWO...)

LUCY: Three...

MINION: (ALIEN THREE...)

LUCY: Four.

MINION: (ALIEN FOU-)

ULJABAAN: Thank you, Gantac, I've managed to commit it to memory.

INT. PUB

F/X: KATRINA AND RICHARD ARE MEETING WITH RON.

RON: Look, I know it isn't in the spirit of it –

RICHARD: It's so far from being in the spirit of it, it can't even see the spirit of it because the spirit of it is over the horizon.

RON: But it's driving up interest in the quiz. Even people who are useless at pub quizzes think they might be in with a chance, if they can get the Computer on their team.

KATRINA: Which means even more co-operation and collaboration and people spying on me.

RON: Of course you've got an unfair advantage, Richard, because you live with her and know everything she's doing.

RICHARD: I'm not going to spy on my own daughter just to win a pub quiz. (BEAT) Although I could shop Lucy for something.

KATRINA: Dad, no. It's not just about winning, it's about protecting the integrity of the pub quiz.

RICHARD: She's right, Ron. This might pull in a few extra punters at first – but anyone who doesn't get the Computer on their team is going to stop turning up, it'll be a foregone conclusion.

RON: They can play for second place.

KATRINA: Who's going to turn up to play for second place? Graham has been entering every week for eight years. You think he's playing for second place? No – he thinks he has a chance of winning.

RON: He doesn't have a chance of winning.

KATRINA: No, but he turns up anyway. And that misguided belief in his ability to overcome his own sub-mediocrity is what makes humanity what it is. But even Graham, slow-witted as he is, will see he can't beat the Computer.

GRAHAM: Are you talking about me?

KATRINA: No, Graham. You just go on doing your wordsearch.

RICHARD: You haven't been eavesdropping, have you?

GRAHAM: Why would I do that?

KATRINA: Ironically, if you'd been eavesdropping on us, then you'd know why you might want to eavesdrop on us.

GRAHAM: I've been concentrating so hard on the wordsearch I didn't notice you were there. I've only got one more word to find and I can't see it for the life of me.

RICHARD: What's the word?

GRAHAM: 'Wordsearch'.

KATRINA: Graham, that's not one of the words you have to find, it's the name of the puzzle.

GRAHAM: So does that mean I've finished?

KATRINA: Yes.

GRAHAM: Then I think I deserve the rest of the day off!

F/X: **GRAHAM LEAVES THE PUB.**

RON: All right – I'm in. But how can we stop this?

RICHARD: We can't stop the Computer entering the quiz.

KATRINA: No. What we need is to somehow make the Computer useless in the quiz.

F/X: **MARGARET ENTERS.**

MARGARET: There you are.

KATRINA: Lucy's not with you, is she?

MARGARET: No, she's busy.

KATRINA: Honestly. Does she realise I'm trying to strike an important blow against the alien occupation here?

MARGARET: I just walked past Graham on the way in. It's a bit early for him, isn't it?

RON: Not these days, Margaret. Things aren't great between him and Carol. Some days she just stares at him until he leaves the house.

MARGARET: You know that until the invasion happened, she was going to leave him and shack up with that chap in Amersham?

RICHARD: Everyone knows that.

MARGARET: Apart from Graham.

KATRINA: Ron... I've got an idea. Announce that you're holding a bonus pub quiz tonight.

RON: I can't do that!

KATRINA: Why not?

RON: Because it's Wednesday. Wednesday night is salsa dancing.

INT. ULJABAAN'S HOUSE

F/X: COMPUTER RUNNING IN BACKGROUND.

ULJABAAN: How goes the interrogation, Computer? Has Miss Alexander talked yet?

COMPUTER: Yes.

ULJABAAN: Excellent!

COMPUTER: But not about the tree.

ULJABAAN: Then what has she talked about?

COMPUTER: Michael Fassbender, whether there's any actual difference between Diet Coke and Coke Zero, why she doesn't use conditioner on her hair –

ULJABAAN: I will speak to her myself.

F/X: ULJABAAN STANDS, ENTERS ROOM WHERE LUCY IS BEING INTERROGATED BY A MINION.

LUCY: ...the second album was really disappointing. Have you heard it?

MINION: (ALIEN NO)

LUCY: It was alright, you know, but wasn't a patch on the first one. Have you heard that?

MINION: (ALIEN NO)

LUCY: Have you heard any Vampire Weekend albums?

MINION: (ALIEN NO)

LUCY: Have you heard any Earth music at all?

MINION: (ER... QUITE LIKE MUMFORD AND SONS)

LUCY: Mumford and Sons? Get out.

ULJABAAN: Yes, Yartek, get out. I'm taking over.

MINION: (ALIEN FINE)

F/X: **MINION STOMPS AWAY.**

LUCY: Yeah, go and listen to your Mumford and Sons.

F/X: **DOOR CLOSES.**

LUCY: (MUTTERS) Mumford and Sons.

ULJABAAN: Now, Miss Alexander. Tell me why you want to protect the tree.

LUCY: I'll never tell you in a million years.

ULJABAAN: Ah, so you admit there is something to tell.

LUCY: (BEAT) Oh yeah. Lying's hard.

ULJABAAN: Then tell me the truth.

LUCY: No.

ULJABAAN: Tell me.

LUCY: Never!

ULJABAAN: Then I shall be forced to use... the mind probe.

LUCY: All right, I'll tell you then.

ULJABAAN: Really?

LUCY: Yeah, I don't want you to use the mind probe. What is the mind probe?

ULJABAAN: It's a device for probing your mind.

LUCY: Sounds nasty.

ULJABAAN: It is. Now speak, youngling! What is the truth behind this tree?

LUCY: (SIGHS) You know how you disabled all communications with the outside world when you invaded the village?

ULJABAAN: Yes.

LUCY: Well you missed one. I found a broadband cable that still works, running under the pear tree in our front garden.

ULJABAAN: If it still works, why haven't you used it to summon help yet?

LUCY: Nobody would believe it, would they? We need evidence first. Anyway, that's why I didn't want you to pull up the tree.

ULJABAAN: Foolish girl. You've played right into my hands. Instead of protecting the tree, your actions have only drawn attention to it.

LUCY: Oh... yeah, I didn't think it through did I.

ULJABAAN: Yartek – gather three other troops, a chainsaw, some shovels and a tractor beam, and convene at Miss Alexander's house. Computer? (PAUSE) Computer?

MINION: (ALIEN EXPLANATION)

ULJABAAN: What do you mean, gone to the pub quiz?

INT. PUB

F/X: PUB ATMOSPHERE. LAWRENCE WALKS PAST, WITH THE COMPUTER.

LAWRENCE: Evening.

MARGARET: Good evening, Lawrence.

LAWRENCE: Margaret? You've picked a bad week to start quizzing. We are going to walk it tonight.

KATRINA: Feeling confident, then?

COMPUTER: Yes. I've checked to make sure I know all of the facts, and I do. I know all of the facts. I've calculated the chances of us winning at ninety-nine point seven six per cent.

LAWRENCE: Why not a hundred?

COMPUTER: Well it is a hundred really, but I never say a hundred because I don't want to get it in the neck if something weird happens.

RON: (D) Right! If you're quizzing tonight, please take your seats.

RICHARD: Good luck, chaps.

COMPUTER: Thank you. We will not be wishing you good luck because luck is an irrational concept.

F/X: LAWRENCE AND THE COMPUTER WALK AWAY.

RON: (D) Welcome to bonus quiz night at the Rose and Crown. Usual form, eighty questions. Eyes down for question one: why did Graham's wife Carol threaten to divorce him in summer 2008?

GRAHAM: What?

RON: (D) Would you like me to repeat the question?

GRAHAM: Not really, no.

RON: (D) Why did Graham's wife Carol threaten to divorce him in summer 2008?

COMPUTER: You mean that Graham, over there?

RON: (D) Yes.

COMPUTER: That's not a proper pub quiz question.

RON: (D) We're in a pub and there was a question mark at the end, what more do you want?

COMPUTER: But the questions can't be about the people involved in the quiz.

RON: (D) Nothing in the rules about it.

COMPUTER: Are all the questions going to be like this?

RON: (D) They're not all going to be about the state of Graham's marriage, no. That would be cruel.

LAWRENCE: Don't you know the answer?

COMPUTER: Of course I don't know!

RICHARD: (LOW) Well, love?

MARGARET: (LOW) It was because he took out a two thousand pound loan to buy a hot tub for their back garden just after she'd been made redundant.

F/X: RICHARD WRITES THIS DOWN.

KATRINA: (LOW) Excellent.

RON: (D) Question two: Who really smashed the passenger window on Janine's Ford Focus on Christmas Eve 2006?

F/X: MUTTERS AND SCRIBBLING.

MARGARET: (LOW) She did it herself.

F/X: RICHARD WRITES THIS DOWN.

RON: (D) And for a bonus point, why?

MARGARET: (LOW) To get out of visiting her father in the hospice on Christmas Day. This is fun!

KATRINA: It's a shame Lucy isn't here.

MARGARET: Yes, I would have thought Uljabaan would have finished interrogating her by now.

KATRINA: Interrogating her?

RON: (D) Question three. How much money did James Gravett lose when his property empire collapsed in 1989?

MARGARET: (LOW) Trick question. He didn't lose anything, it was all in Emily's name.

F/X: RICHARD WRITES THIS DOWN.

KATRINA: Why's Uljabaan interrogating Lucy?

MARGARET: She's been trying to convince him that she and you have found a working broadband cable underneath the pear tree in her front garden.

RICHARD: Have you?

KATRINA: No.

MARGARET: No, Lucy and I made it up.

RON: (D) Question four. Where did John and Cindy's daughter Claire go on her gap year in 2004?

MARGARET: (LOW) Prison.

F/X: RICHARD WRITES THIS DOWN.

KATRINA: Why did you make up this stuff about the broadband cable?

RICHARD: To get rid of the pear tree.

MARGARET: As soon as Lucy started trying to protect it, he got suspicious. Of course we had to make it convincing, so at first she claimed she had a sentimental attachment to the tree.

KATRINA: Lucy doesn't have a sentimental attachment to anything. Except maybe some of the characters from Finding Nemo.

RON: (D) Question five. Which of Elaine and Peter's kids isn't his?

MARGARET: (LOW) Amy. Though I've always had my suspicious about Thomas as well, I mean have you seen how tall he's getting?

RICHARD: (LOW) What should I put?

MARGARET: (LOW) Just put Amy.

F/X: RICHARD WRITES THIS DOWN.

RICHARD: So, you're finally getting your revenge for losing the Best Kept Village competition.

KATRINA: But what's Lucy getting out of it?

MARGARET: I was going to offer her money, but as soon as I mentioned that I wanted to do something that would irritate her parents, she said she was more than happy to help, so I didn't have to.

KATRINA: I think she does harbour some resentment towards the garden and wants to see it destroyed.

RICHARD: She said that?

KATRINA: Maybe not exactly in those words.

RON: (D) Question six. During her breakdown in the summer of 1996, Rachel Tomlinson started stalking which popular television actor?

MARGARET: (LOW) Jimmy Nail.

F/X: RICHARD WRITES THIS DOWN.

EXT. LUCY'S HOUSE

F/X: SOUND OF DIGGING AND UPROOTING.

LUCY: I'm sure it ran under the tree.

ULJABAAN: Rest assured, we will find it. Even if we have to destroy all of these rose bushes.

LUCY: Oh no. I hope you don't have to do that. And if you have to move that creepy cherub statue, be careful not to break it.

ULJABAAN: (TO MINIONS) Move the statue.

F/X: THE STATUE IS DROPPED AND SMASHED INTO PIECES.

LUCY: Maybe it's under the rockery.

ULJABAAN: You think we can be deterred by a few rocks?

LUCY: No, absolutely not.

ULJABAAN: Destroy the rockery!

F/X: CRUNCH OF PICK-AXE INTO ROCKERY.

LUCY: Haha!

INT. PUB

F/X: RON IS READING OUT THE ANSWERS.

RON: (D) ...question seventy-nine – answer to that one is because he was having an affair with a member of the House of Lords who can't be named for legal reasons.

RICHARD: Fantastic, Margaret – I think we're on full marks so far.

MARGARET: Next time perhaps they could make it a bit more challenging.

F/X: ULJABAAN ENTERS.

ULJABAAN: Everyone – an exciting opportunity has suddenly come up to do some work for me!

RON: (D) I'm in the middle of doing the answers for the pub quiz.

ULJABAAN: Oh. I'm sorry.

RON: (D) That's all right. Question eighty –

ULJABAAN: No, I mean I'm sorry if I gave you the impression that I care. I'm digging up the Alexanders' front garden, and it's taking a little longer to find than we expected, so if anyone wants to help, I might see my way to letting you have the Computer for the next quiz...

F/X: EVERYONE IS UNIMPRESSED.

ULJABAAN: Nobody? Not even you, Park Keeper?

LAWRENCE: What, this useless piece of junk?

COMPUTER: See, this is why I never say a hundred per cent, even if I think it is a hundred.

RON: (D) And the answer to question eighty – whose fault was it that we lost the Buckinghamshire Best Kept Village competition in 2009...

MARGARET: Another easy one.

RON: (D) ...is Lucy Alexander.

MARGARET: (BEAT) No, we lost because of all that pear mulch.

LAWRENCE: No, I remember this. We managed to steer the judges away from their street, so they never saw the mess.

RON: (D) But Lucy hid on the roof of the bus shelter and dropped a dog turd on one of the judges.

MARGARET: Is this true?

F/X: PUB SAYS YES.

RON: (D) Bit surprised you didn't know actually.

KATRINA: Mum? What are you going to do to Lucy?

MARGARET: Me? Nothing. Yet.
